The Educated Guess website was born and has now been running for four months.

Ms Freer said there was still some factual data to be collected and parents were being encouraged to add in their opinions on their child's schools or join in the website forums with issues like uniform and homework discussed.

"It's a good time to rate their school," she said.

Volunteers Required

Radiation Tissue Injury Study

We are seeking volunteers who have previously received radiation therapy for cancer treatment and are now experiencing problems months or years later. This international study is being conducted at The Wesley Centre for Hyperbaric Medicine in Brisbane.

This is a non-invasive study investigating the role that hyperbaric oxygen has in reversing the damage done by radiation therapy.

There are no age restrictions, and suitable participants are:

- Those who have had radiotherapy in the area of the bowel, bladder or other sites and have been experiencing symptoms such as bowel or bladder pain, bleeding, non-healing wounds, or other symptoms that may be directly related to the radiotherapy.
- Suitable candidates can not be receiving current treatment for their cancer, and must be at least three months post radiation treatment.
- Able to meet cardiac and respiratory screening processes.
